






# THURSDAY EVENING GOING STRONG!

### RARE & UNIQUE COINS

Looking to buy quality, rare and unique coins? Attend the Friday coin sale! The auction will consist of a maximum of 300 lots. All lots will be listed in our Auction Sale Day Catalog.

The following are among the special coins that will be auctioned:

#### Morgan Dollars

Composed of 90% silver, these are the first standard silver dollars minted after the passage of the Coinage Act of 1873. They are named after their designer, an English engraver named George T. Morgan.

#### **Barber Quarters & Dimes**

Minted between 1892 and 1916, these coins were designed by Charles E. Barber, the Chief Engraver of the U.S. Bureau of the Mint.

# Lincoln Wheat Cents (also called Lincoln Wheat Pennies)

First minted in 1909, these pennies are the first circulating U.S. coins to feature the likeness of a real person, in this case President Abraham Lincoln.

#### Silver Rounds

Silver rounds are privately minted silver coins typically composed of 99.9% silver. They often contain depictions of animals or symbols, and unlike governmentissued coins, silver rounds do not have legal tender status.

# Who We Are

The LCCAA is a live auction event held under several openair tents in the Lancaster County countryside.

Each year, our team of 448 volunteers and 23 auctioneers transform our quiet country fields into a bustling market-place that features 460 consignors and 4,000 event-goers from 27 states and 3 countries!

Proceeds from the auction benefit the Hand-in-Hand Fire Company, the volunteer fire company serving Bird-in-Hand, Pennsylvania.

## **Consigning Process**

Simply pull up the week of the auction during our drop-off days. Our team will make the process easy for you!

*Consignment drop-off days:* Tuesday 6/24 8am-4pm Wednesday 6/25 8am-8pm Thursday 6/26 8am-12pm (no items after noon)

Arrive on-site with your items and check-in at the office. Our team will take a quick inventory and direct you to specialized category crews based on what you are selling (auction blocks). Staff members will help you unload your wares and display your goods. Your items may be registered as a lot or by piece. Consignors will receive copies of their items and lots numbers. All items must be in good, working condition unless antique. Please no appliances or farm equipment unless they are antique quality. On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, there will be 24hour security on site.



### How to Get Free Advertising for Your Items

When you consign by early May, your items can be listed in this flyer that you're reading. But don't worry - you haven't missed your chance at some free advertising!

We update our website daily during sale week to show potential visitors what's for sale!



### Hauling, Storing, & Dropping Off Your Items

We cannot store your items prior to the auction dropoff dates. Items dropped off during the week of the auction will be sorted, displayed, and cared for.

Need help hauling? Contact us for a list of local options.



**Getting Paid** 

All auction items are sold on a consignment model meaning that you take home a cut of the sale, and a portion is also donated to the Hand-in-Hand Fire Company.

After the auction, consignors will receive payment via check that will be mailed within one week of the event. Any unsold items can be picked up directly following the auction or left for donation.



Make a Donation

Your unwanted items donated to our sale generates 100% profit for the Fire Company!

Simply drop off your items during the listed consignment drop-off dates and let our team know that you are making a donation. Receipts for items over \$250.



# FAQ

#### What is a consignment auction?

A consignment auction features sellers who consign their products to an auction house (in this case the seller is Hand-in-Hand Fire Co). The seller can either be an individual or a business. The Fire Co. then acts as the third party and auctions off the items for the seller. In exchange, the Fire Co. receives a portion of the proceeds (see Commission Schedule) and the seller receives the rest.

#### Do I have to consign my items early?

While submitting your consignments in early May get your items exposure in the flyer you're reading, the bulk of our consignments arrive during auction week. You're welcome to just show up during sale week drop-off days to consign! We update our website daily during sale week to show potential visitors what's for sale!

#### Do you accept donations?

Yes! Gather a few friends to collaborate on a homemade project such as a quilt, piece of furniture, a gift basket, or something else. Or, pull together some business associates and donate a high value item for our noon specialty sale. We will recognize your businesses in our flyer and on the auction block.
